For me, sculpture is trusting in the pressure of my own fingers. Whatever is in me, which I do not know, puts pressure on the clay, sometimes precise, when a beautiful eye is imprinted on the clay, and sometimes ruthless, when an ugly hole becomes a pit.

The volumes of my interior appear before my eyes only with the pressure of my fingers, and then I can see what is inside me! Unlike painting, where I look outside, in sculpture I look inside myself. After it is made, I sit, see and think what this is. What was my intention and this circular cycle continues and its meaning is still unclear to me.

The following collection was created during the difficult days of deciding to have children and a time when I was witnessing terrible changes in myself. However, I think it was a reflection of my disillusioned ideas that everyone was pregnant and there was no hope for their children to be born. (It should be noted that I still think this way, and this cycle continues).


